TEXTS: LUKE 6:20, LUKE 14:12-24

THE RECAP: (10 MINUTES)

In week 10 of The Storyteller series Pastor Adam Flynt taught on the parable of The Great Banquet in Luke 14. In this parable Jesus explains that the Kingdom of God is:

like a never-ending party, anywhere The King rules and reigns, a Kingdom of grace, by divine invitation, not self-qualification.

Jesus invites those that are spiritually poor (all of us) to come feast with Him.

TEACHING & DIALOGUE

After Jesus heals a man at the beginning of Luke 14 who is physically, spiritually, and socially unclean he tells two parables. The second of the parables is about a great banquet referencing the Kingdom of God. Those invited to the party make excuses and choose other things as top priority, but no matter the number of RSVP's the banquet is not postponed. The master moves forward with his plans and invites those that are willing to say yes to the invitation. Just like the Kingdom of God, there will be some who deny the Lordship of Christ and others who respond rightly to the Gospel but the Kingdom of God will always continue to exist and advance.

Have someone read Luke 14:12-24 out loud.

- 1. When you think of the Kingdom of God what do you think of?
 (Is it centered around worshipping Jesus? Does everyone look the same?)
- 2. What does the Kingdom of God tell us about God's character?
 (He earnestly invites those far away to come to Him. Jesus came to seek and save the lost.)
- 3. What excuses are you making right now in regards to accepting God's invitation to discover and deepen a relationship with Jesus Christ? Why are you holding onto those excuses? (Too busy? Not a priority?)

Have someone read Luke 6:20 out loud.

This beatitude has nothing to do with the amount of money a person has, but rather the condition of their soul. Everyone is born with a sinful, deceitful heart (Psalm 51:5, Jeremiah 17:9, Ephesians 2:3) which makes all of mankind objects of God's wrath. All are spiritually poor and are in desperate need of a Savior. Jesus is the Savior who paid our debt on the cross and beat death by rising from the grave. The spiritually poor are invited into the Kingdom of God because of the grace of the King.

- 4. What do you functionally believe will satisfy your soul more than Jesus? (Money, power, a spouse, children?)
- 5. What/who are you compelled about concerning the Kingdom of God? What are you doing about it? (Ex. Single moms, orphans, addicts, etc. If you can't answer this ask God to change your heart and set your mind on His Kingdom. Read His Word and let Him break your heart for what breaks His.)
